SATs Week

Sun Awareness

Children's University

Thank you for sending in your children's passports. We are working through them as quickly as we can.

We have been asked to remind parents and children that regular sporting activities are only allowed to count for 10 hours of each certificate. This is deliberately done by Children's University to encourage children to try out new things. For example, if a child is a member of a swimming club and swims for an hour three mornings a week, only the first 10 hours can be put into the passport for each certificate after the first Bronze award (30 hours).

We have a number of children who have passports with some hours that will, unfortunately, not be able to be counted.
